



## Overview of work of UNEG Membership Committee in 2022

The UNEG Membership Committee (MC) worked actively in 2022 in support of its agreed mandate acting as first point of contact for prospective UNEG Members and providing ongoing support to newly – admitted UNEG Members and Observers.

The Committee engaged with the evaluation divisions of five organisations interested in UNEG membership, helping four of them (United Nations Department of Safety and Security; United Nations University; the United Nations Global Fund to fight AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria, and the Office of the Special Advisor for Africa) explore opportunities for UNEG Observer Membership and one (the Department of Management Strategy, Policy and Compliance) move from Observer to full UNEG Member Status. The results of these discussions are included in the Table below.

The Committee also engaged with recently-joined Members as well as stepped up its outreach activities to the broader UN community, leading a joint OIOS/DMSPC workshop on the mandate and activities of the UN Evaluation Group in the context of the Secretary General's instruction for entities to take concrete steps to formalize the policy and practice of evaluation in the Secretariat.

The Committee was less active in its support to existing UNEG Members. One area for discussion at the AGM could be what form of support Members would most welcome from the Committee. This could include, for example, peer support around different aspects of the Norms and Standards (well in advance of peer review exercises, for example) or more *ad hoc* support on specific issues relating to UNEG Membership or to UNEG's broader work within the international evaluation system.
